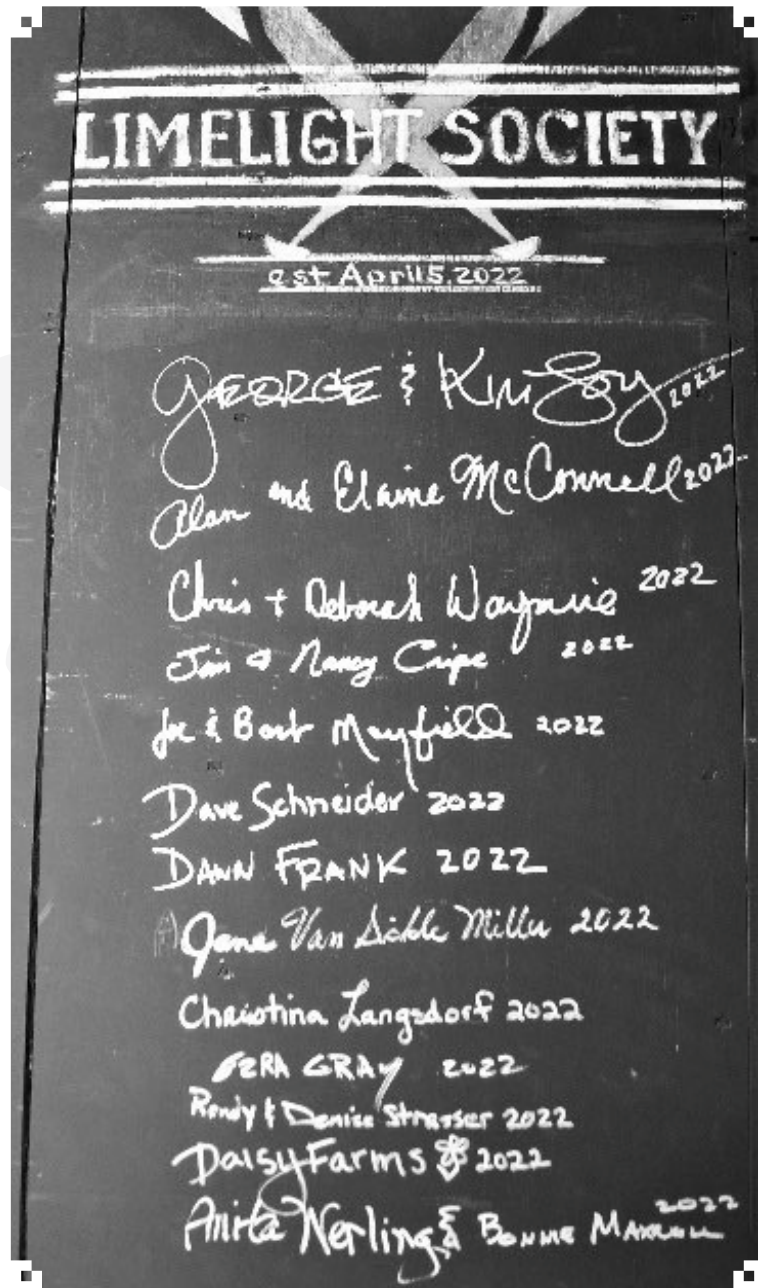

Delphi Preservation Society & Delphi Opera House New Legacy Series and Limelight Society

The Delphi Preservation Society and Delphi Opera House Legacy Series was conceived in 2020 and initiated in 2021. This series was created to showcase people who are making a lasting contribution and who serve as an example of the dual role the Delphi Opera House plays in our community honoring our history while ensuring a bright future for generations to come. Honorees in this series will represent media, business, agriculture, education, and the arts. They may have moved away or remained close by. They may be retired or just launching their careers. All are leaving a legacy.

Our first honoree was Rena Brouwer, award-winning watercolor artist, long-time Carroll County resident, and one of the owners of the Opera House Gallery of Contemporary Art. Her Legacy Event was held in October 2021, titled Painting on the Edge. It was a delightful Sunday afternoon tea where she painted a lovely landscape to the music of pianist Cheryl Kaldahl.

Our second Legacy event was held in April and honored Abbie VanSickle, Pulitzer Prize winning investigative journalist and DHS graduate from 2000 along with Brian Lamb, founder of C-Span, and grandson of Peter Lamb, who was a member of the Delphi Dramatic Club back in the early 1900's. Brian Lamb grew up in Lafayette, where he attended Lafayette Jefferson HS, and then Purdue University, where he was honored with the naming of the Brian Lamb School of Communication in 2011. This event was a lovely sit-down dinner followed by a program in which Jeff Smith, TV-18 news anchor, interviewed Abbie and Brian onstage.

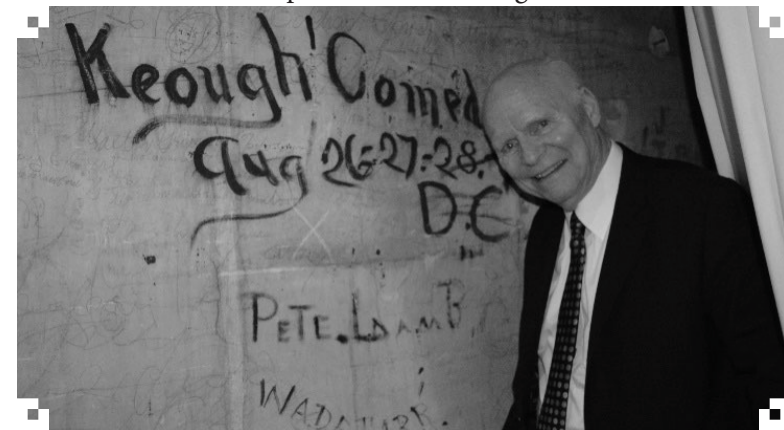
